

The following is a description of the responsibilities for SVC **student** judges, designed for use as a general solicitation.

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Subject: Seeking Student Judges for Information Security Awareness Poster and Video Contest 2011

The EDUCAUSE & Internet2 Higher Education Information Security Council is currently seeking approximately 10 students to be part of a panel of judges for the Information Security Awareness Poster and Video Contest 2011. This contest is a search for creative, topical, and effective information security awareness posters and videos developed by college students for college students.

Judges will select three winners from each of three categories: posters, training videos (two minutes or less), and Public Service Announcements (30 seconds). A total of \$9,000 will be awarded: three "gold" prizes of \$1,500, three "silver" prizes of \$1,000 and three "bronze" prizes of \$500. Honorable mention prizes will also be awarded. The contest is now open and has a deadline of March 11, 2011. Note: Judges are ineligible to enter the contest.

Judges will take part in two rounds of poster and video evaluation during the months of March and April 2011. During the first round, teams of judges will be assigned a subset of the submitted videos and posters. The highest rated submissions in each subsection will then be combined into one final group for a final evaluation by the entire panel of judges. The target date for selection of winners is April 25, 2011.

As a judge, you will be able to view and evaluate videos and posters online, based on the criteria outlined on the contest's website, <http://www.educause.edu/SecurityVideoContest2011>. You will also be expected to commit a short period of time in early March to familiarize yourself with the online evaluation website.
